AIM

An Erasmus+ project PrevInf aims to improve nursing students' competency related to HAI prevention and control and foster good quality nursing skills in Asian Higher Education Institutions.

OBJECTIVE

To develop the two Vietnamese and Cambodian universities' nursing curriculums to strengthen HAI prevention and control education.

The method used in the project is to evaluate and update the Asian Universities pedagogical methods, innovate new teaching and learning methods and integrate into their local contexts.

RESULTS

- PrevInf Model, which contains new pedagogical methods and instructions for their implementation.
- Didactically designed e-book to strengthen Asian students independent learning and foster educators' knowledge for designing, piloting and implementing of simulation scenarios.

CONCLUSION

To enhance the IPC education, the PrevInf Model and the e-book, including simulation scenarios, will be piloted in Asian Universities with nursing students (n=300-400) and educators (n=100). Final version of the e-book will foster educators to update their knowledgebase, develop digital pedagogical skills and online learning methods of IPC. Simulations will allow students to implement their HAI know-how safely in authentic environments and receive valuable feedback.
